Local News and Priorities

OPERATION PARAMOUNT – Road Safety

There have been some concerns raised recently regarding the speed of vehicles around a number of the villages within the Howe of Fife.

During the month of April, your local officers deployed with the Unipar on a number of occasions resulting in a number of driver's being warned. Officers will continue to monitor these areas and carry out further speed checks.





PC Lowe attended Falkland Primary School during the month of April and along with Safer Communities and delivered inputs to two separate assemblies. The first being P1 to P3 and the second being P4 to P7. This was aimed at highlighting Road Safety following some recent incidents at the local crossing near to the primary school.

These sessions were impactful and between various organisations, talks are ongoing to see what measures/changes could be implemented to help alleviate the issues.

COFFEE WITH A COP

Your local officers are keen to attend as many "Coffee With A Cop" events across the Howe of Fife. These events are designed for your local officers to meet with members of the local community and listen to any concerns, provide advice and develop relationships.

Vehicle Security Advice

Police Scotland would like to offer preventative advice in relation to the increase in UK wide keyless vehicle thefts.

Relay theft vehicles fitted with a smart or passive key are susceptible to relay theft. This key system allows you to gain entry and start your vehicle without the need to interact with your vehicle's key. Criminals use specialist equipment that has the ability to grab the signal from your car to the smart key so that it appears to the car that the key is present.

Your vehicle is most vulnerable overnight, particularly if parked on your driveway or directly outside your home. How to prevent this:

When not in use – either at home or when out and about – store your keys (including spare keys) in a security pouch. Security pouches are sometimes termed Faraday bags or signal blockers/shields and there are many security rated versions on the market. These will prevent the signal from your vehicle being captured using electronic devices.

Keep updated with latest software: many manufacturers are updating there in-car security systems to stay ahead of these attacks.
