OPERATION PARAMOUNT – Road Safety

Following our recruitment campaign we have successfully trained and deployed 5 community speedwatch volunteers in the month of May.

Their first deployment was on the B937 Giffordtown where they subsequently observed a total of 5 vehicles travelling at excessive speeds. The registered keepers of the offending vehicles were subsequently issued with warning letters.

The intention is utilise these volunteers amongst others in the vetting process to deploy in other villages throughout the Howe of Fife.

Vehicle Security Advice

Police Scotland would like to offer preventative advice in relation to the increase in UK wide keyless vehicle thefts.

Relay theft vehicles fitted with a smart or passive key are susceptible to relay theft. This key system allows you to gain entry and start your vehicle without the need to interact with your vehicle's key. Criminals use specialist equipment that has the ability to grab the signal from your car to the smart key so that it appears to the car that the key is present.

Your vehicle is most vulnerable overnight, particularly if parked on your driveway or directly outside your home. How to prevent this:

When not in use – either at home or when out and about – store your keys (including spare keys) in a security pouch. Security pouches are sometimes termed Faraday bags or signal blockers/shields and there are many security rated versions on the market. These will prevent the signal from your vehicle being captured using electronic devices.

Keep updated with latest software: many manufacturers are updating there in-car security systems to stay ahead of these attacks.
