OPERATION PREVAIL

PC's Haddow and Lowe alongside Fife Coast and Countryside Trust carried out a joint patrol in the Howe of Fife Area where they carried out foot patrols at Birnie and Gaddon Loch which are some of the local hotspots known for wild camping and illegal poaching. The purpose of this visit was to inform and educate any persons found to be carrying out such activities with regards to anti-social behaviour, littering and wild fires. On this occasion there were no issues however another joint patrol is planned for September.

OPERATION PARAMOUNT – OPERATION CLOSE PASS



Operation Close Pass is an initiative to reduce the number of accidents caused by drivers not providing enough space to people riding bikes. The initiative is to ensure drivers give an adequate distance to cyclists on the roads and pass them only when safe to do so. Drivers who do not give adequate space are brought back to a designated point for a "chat on the mat" and advice is provided to empathise the safety of the cyclists.

On 16th August, 2023, PC Mark Lowe and PS Joanna Peddie,

along with RP Officer (pictured) participated in this event with a number of road users being warned regarding their distance and passing too close to cyclists, one driver reported for no insurance, and one warning issued re navigating a roundabout. This engagement has assisted in reinforcing road safety for both drivers and cyclists alike.
