OPERATION PARAMOUNT

Officers have continued to conduct speed checks of the ward area through Unipar and Pop up Bob deployments to assist local communities who continue to experience speed related issues.

OPERATION PREVAIL

Community officers have been on foot patrol throughout the ward area. The continued deployment on foot is providing officers a greater understanding of local concerns regarding anti-social behaviour. Mobile patrols of the ward area have also continued especially over the weekends. Officers have continued to collaborate with partner agencies to address any concerns raised. Community officers continue to have open dialogue with our young persons, and this has been well received and further developed the relations between Police assisting with keeping our young people safe.
