MINUTES OF DUNSHALT COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION MEETING HELD ON 18 APRIL 2022

Council Matters Cllr Lothian reported that the Eden footbridge, broken fence at Nethermyres, and Eden stone bridge repairs are in hand. The Police Community Team will be asked to respond to requests about restarting the Speedwatch volunteer programme. Speeding remains an issue across all communities.Traffic calming issues on Main Street are in awaiting action. Reports of dog fouling in and around the playpark have been noted. The Community Safety Officer will be invited to attend a future 'drop in' event to a raise awareness. Cllr Lothian was thanked for attending.

Playpark Re-development – consultation with Fife Council on the plans are progressing well with feedback submitted and amendments made. Agreed that £38 recently raised for the Playpark Fund can be held in the DCA account.

Hall Roof Repair Noted that following initial repairs the urgency to complete the entire roof repair is not quite so great. At the May meeting agreed that a plan should be made for phasing the repairs over perhaps 2 years or more, applications made to funding bodies, and publicity designed to raise funds within and beyond the community, including during the Platinum Jubilee weekend 3-5 June.

Treasurer's report SM circulated the accounts to April 2022. The roof repairs will present challenges, alongside increased energy bills. Further hall bookings are beginning to increase income and most welcome. These include a Mother and Toddlers group commencing this month on Tuesdays 1-3pm, and physio clinic on Mondays and Wednesdays, 10-6pm daytime in the meeting room. A cleaner has been appointed, on Tuesday afternoons after the Mother and Toddlers group. DCA volunteers asked to assist with top-up cleaning on Thursdays.

Sheets for the100 Club collection were shared, and money collected should be passed to the Treasurer by the end of June at the latest.

New projects: The Easter Egg Hunt to be held on 16/17 April, organised by Alison and Rachel, in and around the Park was a great success with up to 30 children and their families attending. Noted that the hall lights replacement has significantly improving the brightness of the space. GM and SM will purchase a shed for storage of the donated mower, fete items currently stored in the hall and gardening equipment. S McDonald has kindly agreed to paint the hall door,

IM to write a letter of thanks to the uniformed organisations for the fantastic response to the tree planting effort on Sunday 13 March.
